Blessed be God, the one who forms us, + Jesus who bears the cross, the Spirit who makes our joy complete. **Amen.**


Let us bow before God in humility, confessing our sin.

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 15:15-21

The first reading is in Jeremiah chapter 15, verses 15-21.

O LORD, you know; remember me and visit me, and bring down retribution for me on my persecutors. In your forbearance do not take me away; know that on your account I suffer insult. Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart; for I am called by your name, O LORD, God of hosts. I did not sit in the company of merrymakers, nor did I rejoice; under the weight of your hand I sat alone, for you had filled me with indignation. Why is my pain unceasing, my wound incurable, refusing to be healed? Truly, you are to me like a deceitful brook, like waters that fail. Therefore thus says the LORD: If you turn back, I will take you back, and you shall stand before me. If you utter what is precious, and not what is worthless, you shall serve as my mouth. It is they who will turn to you, not you who will turn to them. And I will make you to this people a fortified wall of bronze; they will fight against you, but they shall not prevail over you, for I am with you to save you and deliver you, says the LORD. I will deliver you out of the hand of the wicked, and redeem you from the grasp of the ruthless.

Romans 12:9-21


The second reading is in Romans chapter 12, verses 9-21.

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.







CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your household or small group:

- What does it mean to forgive someone? Do you find it difficult or easy to forgive? Why?
- What does God's forgiveness mean to you?
- · How does God's forgiveness change the way we see and treat other people when they sin against us?

DEVOTIONS

As part of your household devotional times this week, spend a few minutes admitting your sins to each other and asking for and receiving words of forgiveness. Each person may say: *"I am sorry for (name a particular thing) and ask you to forgive me."* Others may respond: *"God has forgiven me, and I forgive you in his name."* Express your forgiveness with a handshake, hug or kiss.

SERVICE

Romans 13:9 tells us that whatever commandments there are can be summed up in this one rule: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Challenge members of your household to each do at least one act of kindness for another person every day this week (whether at school, work or home). Report on your efforts at evening mealtimes. Share about how your acts of kindness were received by others.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Jesus promises that wherever two or three people come together in his name, he is with them (Matthew 18:20). This week, light a candle when you meet as a household to symbolize Christ's presence with you, and say together: "We come together in Jesus' name. And he is right here with us."
