

Yet we do sin against one another, and Jesus' challenge that we forgive seventy-seven times reveals God's boundless mercy. When we hear the words of forgiveness in worship and sign ourselves with the cross, we are renewed in baptism to be signs of reconciliation in the world.


Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

WORD

FIRST READING: Genesis 50:15-21

Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, "What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?" So they approached Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this instruction before he died, 'Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you.' Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, "We are here as your slaves." But Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones." In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

The Word of the Lord Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING: Romans 14:1-12

Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God.


We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. For it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God." So then, each of us will be accountable to God.

GOSPEL READING:

Matthew 18:21-35

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 18th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord."

Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for




times.

him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, 'Pay what you owe.' Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."



SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK

"You are merciful, Lord! You are kind and patient and always loving." Psalm 145:8 (CEV)

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

Lord, you are so generous to us. Help us to be generous to others. Amen. (Matthew 20:1-16)

Mealtime Prayer:

God so generous, God so good, we thank you for our daily food. Bless our meal and with us stay, guide and keep us through this day. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the Lord be kind to you and help you to live for him. Amen. (Psalm 145:8-9; Philippians 1:21)

CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you felt you were treated unfairly.
- Jesus told a parable about some vineyard workers (read Matthew 20:1-16). How do you think you would have felt if you were one of those hired last?
- Should we be bothered if we see God being generous to others? Why or why not?

DEVOTIONS

When Jonah was thrown overboard into the sea, God kept him from drowning by sending a whale to swallow him (Jonah 1:15-17). Draw or cut out a picture of whale. When you gather for your evening meals this week, share ways in which God provided for you during the day. Write these onto "sticky notes" and attach them to your whale. Say a prayer of thanks to God for his generosity to your household.

SERVICE

Psalm 145:4 says: "Each generation will announce to the next your wonderful deeds." Talk about people from older or younger generations who have shared Christ with you. Draw them a picture, make them a card or write them a note to say thanks. If possible, invite them to your home to share a meal with you.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

September 21st is the day on which the Christian church remembers the apostle Matthew, one of Jesus' original twelve apostles (most of the Gospel readings for this year are from Matthew's Gospel). One day, while Matthew (also called Levi) was seated at his table of books and money, Jesus looked at him and said two words: "Follow me." This was all that was needed to make Matthew rise and leave behind his pieces of silver to follow Christ. Matthew then hosted a great banquet at his home to which he invited his fellow tax-collectors. The Jews were surprised to see Jesus with a tax collector, but Jesus explained that he had come "not to call the righteous, but sinners" (Luke 5:27-32). Host a "Matthew Party" at your home this week. Invite friends from your church to join you. Share your favorite stories from the Gospel of Matthew and whatever information you can discover from books or the Internet about the later life and ministry of Saint Matthew.
