

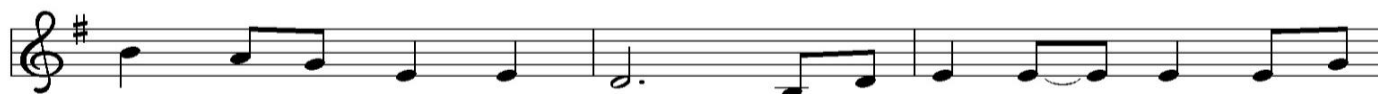

PRESENTATION OF PLAQUES TO THREE-YEAR-OLDS

Jesus says *“Let the little children come to me.”* Three years ago you children were baptized and the Pastor put water on your head. Maybe some of you even cried a little bit. Jesus loves you and said you were one of his children, too. Your parents promised to bring you to church where you can learn about Jesus and sing songs, and they promised that they would teach you about Jesus.

So, now you have started to come to TREK with other boys and girls and last week you put your hand in something blue and made a hand print on a piece of paper. I notice that your hand prints all look different. None are the same. We all are different and yet God loves us as we are. We can be very happy about that. The plaque says JESUS LOVES YOU. It also tells the day you were baptized.

One day mothers were bringing their little children to Jesus so he could put his hands on their heads and bless them, but some of the people with Jesus through he was too busy to take time out to hold the children. Jesus scolded them for thinking he had no time for children and then sat down and took the children up in his arms and put his hands upon them and blessed them, like I do when you come to Communion with your parents. I put my hand on your head and bless you.

Now while I pray I want you and your parents to put your knees on this cushion here and they will put their hands on your head as Jesus did many years ago. It's a way of saying that Jesus loves you.

Dear Jesus, these children have been brought to you to have you lay your hands on them. You are telling them they belong to you and that you have time for them. We pray that they will always have time to learn about you in the stories of the Bible. As they grow in years help them to understand and believe that you were nailed to the cross to take away their sins. In your name we pray, Lord Jesus. Amen.

FIRST READING

Amos 6:1a, 4-7

The first reading is in Amos chapter 6, verses 1a and 4-7. The prophet Amos announces that Israel's great wealth is a cause not for rejoicing but rather sorrow, because God's people have forgotten how to share their wealth with the poor. The wealthy will be the first to go into exile when judgment comes.

Woe to those who are at ease in Zion and for those who feel secure on Mount Samaria. Woe to those who lie on beds of ivory and lounge on their couches and eat lambs from the flock and calves from the stall, who sing idle songs to the sound of the harp and like David improvise on instruments of music, who drink wine from bowls and anoint themselves with the finest oils but are not grieved over the ruin of Joseph! Therefore they shall now be the first to go into exile, and the revelry of the loungers shall pass away.

SECOND READING

1 Timothy 6:6-19

The second reading is in 1 Timothy chapter 6, verses 6-19. Timothy is reminded of the confession he made at his baptism and of its implications for daily life. His priorities will be different from those of people who merely want to be rich.


Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment, for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it, but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen. As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches but rather on God, who richly provides us with everything

for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

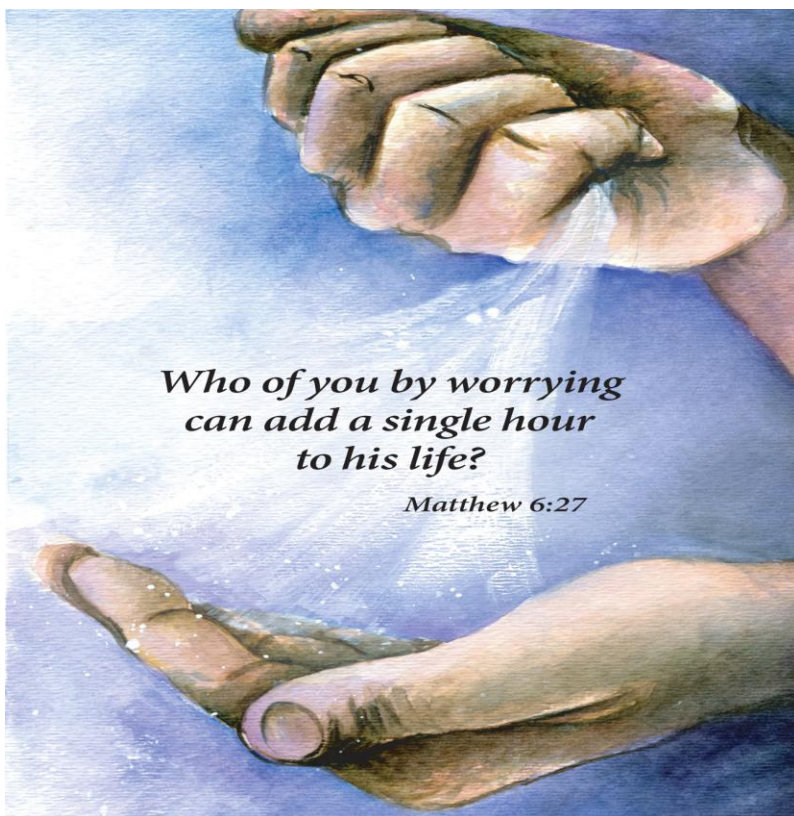
I will close with this poem about the Worry Cross that you will also get to keep-

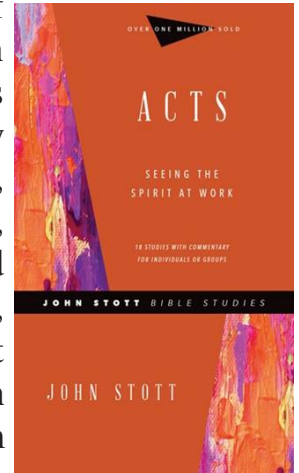
