

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. In \pm Jesus Christ your sins are forgiven and all things are made new. Rejoice in this good news! **Amen.**


GREETING

When God's people were surrounded by hardship, suffering, and grief, Isaiah proclaimed,

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. (Isaiah 61:1-3a)

FIRST READING Isaiah 64:1-9

The First Reading is in Isaiah Chapter 64, verses 1-9.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence — as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil — to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. Yet, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. Do not be exceedingly angry, O LORD, and do not remember iniquity forever. Now consider, we are all your people.

The Second Reading is in 1 Corinthians Chapter 1, verses 3-9.


Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the 13th chapter.


Glory to you, O Lord.

From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake — for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

NICENE CREED

The Lord be with you.




Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

These readings are related to the Lectionary readings for this Sunday. We invite you to take time each day to read the assigned Bible passage.

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK:

Always be joyful and never stop praying. Whatever happens, keep thanking God because of Jesus Christ. This is what God wants you to do. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (CEV)

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

Lord Jesus, you are our true light. Help us to reflect your light to others. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

Come, Lord Jesus, come. Come to our table. Come into our hearts. Come and give us joy. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May God keep your whole spirit, body and soul safe until Jesus Christ comes again. The grace of our Lord be with you. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION:

Discuss in your household or small group:

- What does it mean to be joyful? Share a time when you were filled with joy.
- Is there a difference between joy and happiness? Explain your answer.
- The apostle Paul tells Christians to "be joyful always." Why can all Christians be joyful? How do we show our joy?

DEVOTIONS:

If you have not already done so, set up a household Advent wreath. In your home devotion times this week, light three candles and use the following liturgy:

<u>Leader</u>: "In the third week of Advent we light three candles – the candles of hope, peace and now joy. We are getting ready to celebrate the birthday of Jesus, who is the joy of our lives."

On each day of the week have a different family member read a Bible passage about joy: Psalm 5:11, Psalm 28:7, Jeremiah 31:11-13, Luke 2:10- 11, Acts 16:34, Galatians 5:22, 3 John 1:4. Talk about the verse. Then, form a circle by joining hands around the candles. Say these words:

Leader: "Our household is a circle that is held together by the joy of God."

Response: "Come, Lord Jesus, and give us joy. Amen."

Conclude by singing one or more verses of the carol, "Joy to the World."

SERVICE:

Bake Christmas cookies in special shapes for Advent and Christmas and package to give away to your neighbors. If possible, use icing to write the word "Joy" on the cookies.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:

Set up a shoebox as an empty manger in a prominent spot in your home (e.g. on the kitchen table). Next to the manger, place a little bundle of "straw" (if you don't have real straw, shredded paper or scraps of yarn will do). Each evening, get together as a family and talk about the good things you've done for others during the day. For every good deed, the person who did the good deed gets to place one "straw" in the manger. On Christmas Eve, place a Baby Jesus figure in the manger, on the soft bed you've made for him with your acts of love and service.
