

THE LORD JESUS CHRIST WELCOMES ALL! We are gathered in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ who beckons us to come to Him in faith and repentance. GATHERING

WE PREPARE: The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Lent is a season of repentance. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

WORD

FIRST READING Isaiah 55:1-9

The first reading is in Isaiah chapter 55, verses 1 - 9.

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the LORD, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.


The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 10:1-13

The second reading is in 1 Corinthians chapter 10, verses 1 - 13.

I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ. Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them, and they were struck down in the wilderness.

Now these things occurred as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not become idolaters as some of them did; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and they rose up to play." We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by serpents. And do not complain as some of them did, and were destroyed by the destroyer. These things happened to them to serve as an example, and they were written down to instruct us, on whom the ends of the ages have come. So if you think you are standing, watch out that you do not fall. No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.



GOSPEL

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke the 13th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them — do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

On Feb. 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Airports are now shut, and few railway lines are operational. Civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. Hundreds of thousands of people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter, basic necessities and pastoral care.



SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK



Turn to the Lord! He can still be found. Call out to God! He is near. Give up your crooked ways and your evil thoughts. Return to the Lord our God. He will be merciful and forgive your sins. Isaiah 55:6-7 SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

O God, show us your mercy and love as we turn to you each day. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

Mealtime is here, O what a spread! Thanks be to God, who gives us bread. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May God satisfy your deepest needs. May God show you kindness and be your helper. Amen. (Psalm 63:3-7)

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

Are you a patient or an impatient person? When is it hard to be patient?

Read Jesus' parable about the fig tree (Luke 13:6-8). Where do you see patience shown in this story? How is God patient with us? Being forgiven is the heart of the grace and mercy of God. Talk about a time you have been forgiven.

DEVOTIONS

The theme of repentance runs through the Bible readings for this Sunday. God gives us the Ten Commandments to help us examine our thoughts, words, and actions. In your family devotion times this week, listen together to the Ten Commandments and talk about what they mean.

You shall have no other gods. You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. You shall not steal.

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Honor your father and your mother. You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

You shall not kill.

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse, or their manservant, or their maidservant, or their cattle, or anything that is your neighbor's.

SERVICE

"Come all you who are thirsty, come to the waters" (Isaiah 55:1-2). With this passage in mind, commit to drinking only water at home this week. Estimate what you will save and donate it to a worthy cause. Use this opportunity to reflect on God's gift of water and our new birth through the waters of baptism.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Repentance is above all else gaining a new mind, a new way of seeing things. Use Psalm 51:10 as a Lenten greeting with family and friends: One person says, "Create in me a clean heart, O God." The other responds, "and put a new and right spirit within me." This can be done with a spirit of joy by doing a "high-five" as the words are ex-changed.
