

Seeking reconciliation with God and neighbor, let us remember the gift of baptism and confess our sin.


Silence is kept for reflection.

WORD

FIRST READING

1 Kings 19:15-16, 19-21

The first reading is in 1 Kings chapter 19, verses 15-16 and 19-21.

Then the LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place.

So he set out from there, and found Elisha son of Shaphat, who was plowing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle over him. He left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you." Then Elijah said to him, "Go back again; for what have I done to you?" He returned from following him, took the yoke of oxen, and slaughtered them; using the equipment from the oxen, he boiled their flesh, and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out and followed Elijah, and became his servant.

SECOND READING Galatians 5:1, 13-25

The second reading is in Galatians chapter 5, verses 1 and 13-25.

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.


For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke the 9th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.







CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your home or small group:

Tell about a time you needed help from others.

Jesus showed compassion to the widow of Nain. Tell about a time you showed compassion for someone in need.

How does Jesus help us when we are sad or in need?

DEVOTIONS

The widow in Luke 7:11-14 had just lost her son. Without a husband or son to care for her, she now was a person who had little or no way of providing for her daily needs. This story from Luke is the first time Jesus is mentioned as "Lord." Jesus is seen as Lord not because of military, economic, or political might but because of his great compas-sion. Read Luke 7:11-17, then with family and/or friends reenact the story with parts for the widow, son, crowd, and Jesus. Afterward, talk about what the experience meant to the widow, the son, the crowd, and Jesus. Conclude by offering prayers for people in need and the work of the church to be the hands and voice of Jesus in the world.

SERVICE

Who do you know who is in need of care and support? Plan an act of kindness to en-courage them, such as putting together a bouquet of flowers, visiting with a plate of cookies, or sending them a card or a message using social media.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Practice Christian traditions that honor Jesus as Lord and the importance of compas-sion in the Christian faith.

Consider some of the following:

Regularly use mealtime prayers.

Sing or pray Christian hymns or praise songs during the week.

Go for a walk and pray for the care of creation.

Pray for people in need.

Gather with others in your household for bedtime prayers.
