


Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

WORD

FIRST READING Exodus 19:2-8a

The first reading is from the book of Exodus, Chapter 19, verses 2-8a.

The Israelites had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain. Then Moses went up to God; the LORD called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites: You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Indeed, the whole earth is mine, but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites."

So Moses came, summoned the elders of the people, and set before them all these words that the LORD had commanded him. The people all answered as one: "Everything that the LORD has spoken we will do."

SECOND READING Romans 5:1-8


The second reading is from the book of Romans, Chapter 5, verses 1-8.

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

The Word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**.


GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 9th & 10th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.




These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for laborers deserve their food. Whatever town or village you enter, find out who in it is worthy, and stay there until you leave. As you enter the house, greet it. If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you. If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet as you leave that house or town. Truly I tell you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town.

See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; and you will be dragged before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles. When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next; for truly I tell you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes.


THANKSGIVING




Help Grow Leaders in Rural Ministry

CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you needed some help and someone was kind to you.
- · How has God been kind to you?
- · God asks us to show our thanks by being kind, helpful and welcoming to others. What are some practical ways to do so?

DEVOTIONS

Jesus said that anyone who gave one of his least important followers a cup of cool water—just because that person was his follower—would be rewarded (Matthew 10:42). Even small acts of kindness to others do not escape God's attention! Put an empty water jug or pitcher in your home devotion area. When you gather during the week, share ways in which you have been able to help others, whether in big or small ways. Each time someone shares, pour a cup of water into the jug.

Read Matthew 10:42 and say together this prayer: Lord Jesus, thank you for serving us. Please make us always ready to serve others, in big ways and in small ways. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus said that anyone who welcomes one of his followers welcomes him, and in turn welcomes God (Matthew 10:40). Extend a welcome to an individual or household from your congregation or another congregation to join you for a meal in your home (preferably people you don't know very well). Discuss how best to make them feel welcome and divide tasks among members of your household (such as preparing your home, serving drinks or snacks, entertaining, cleaning up). Remember that in serving your visitors, you are serving Christ himself!

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

July 4th, is Independence Day in the United States. Take a few moments on this day to give thanks to God for blessing your country. Talk about what you appreciate about your nation.

Next, read Psalm 117 and pray together. Lord of all nations, we thank you for our nation and the rich blessings you have poured upon us. As we celebrate our freedom on this day, we give thanks most of all for the freedom we have in Christ. Lead us to use our freedom to serve others, and our blessings to bless them. Amen.
