SECOND READING Philippians 3:4b-14

The second reading is in Philippians chapter 3, verses 4b - 14.


If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith.

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

John 12:1-8


The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 12th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor? (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

MARCH 2022

On Feb. 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Airports are now shut, and few railway lines are operational. Civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. Hundreds of thousands of people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter, basic necessities and pastoral care.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

What is the best gift you have ever given? Ever received?

Mary anointed Jesus' feet with very expensive perfume (read John 12:1-8). Why do you think she did this?

If you could see and touch Jesus today, what gift would you give him? Why?

DEVOTIONS

In Sunday's Gospel reading, we hear that Mary (sister of Martha and Lazarus) anointed Jesus' feet with nard, a very expensive perfume imported from the Himalayas. Nard was used to prepare bodies for burial. By anointing Jesus, Mary was pointing forward to his sufferings and death soon thereafter. As part of your home devotions this week, use perfume or scented oil and "anoint" one another's hands with it. Say this prayer together:

"Lord Jesus, thank you for dying on the cross for us. Make our lives like a sweet per-fume, attracting others to you. Amen."

SERVICE


Mary surprised Jesus with a special gift of love. Prepare a special gift of love for a friend, neighbor, or relative (money need not be spent).

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

When the Apostle Paul wrote, "Nothing is as wonderful as knowing Christ Jesus my Lord" (Philippians 3:8), he is stating that faith in Christ is at the center of our lives. Take time during the week to say or send a message using social media to family and friends, "Nothing is as wonderful as knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." Let this be a time of reflection as you prepare for Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter. As part of your devotions, light a candle and meditate on this passage in silence.
