



FIRST READING Acts 7:55-60

The first reading is in Acts chapter 7, verses 55-60.

But filled with the Holy Spirit, he gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. Look, he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

SECOND READING 1 Peter 2:2-10

The second reading is in First Peter chapter 2, verses 2 - 10.

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation — if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner,"

and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people;

once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.




GOSPEL John 14:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 14th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.




THANKSGIVING



SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week: We love you, Lord Jesus. Help us to care for others as you care for us. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer: Bless this meal, O God, we pray, and bless us too throughout this day. Keep us safe and close to you,

and kind in all we say and do. Amen.

A Blessing to Give: May the Lord show you kindness. May God take away your sadness and fill you with joy. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Have you ever let someone down or been let down? Share your story.
- · How did Peter let Jesus down?
- In John 21:15-19, we read that Jesus asked Peter three questions. Why do you think he did this?
- Jesus gave Peter a new start. How has Jesus given you a new start?
- Do you find it hard or easy to give others a new start? Why?

DEVOTIONS

When Jesus appeared to his disciples after the resurrection, they were fishing and pulled in a net full of large fish—153 to be precise. In your home devotion times this week, share ways in which you have been blessed by God's presence in your lives. Begin by saying, "God blessed me today with ..." Write each response down on a fish-shaped piece of paper and place in a "net" (perhaps use a large envelope marked with lines to resemble a net). See how many "fish" you can collect over the week; you may even count 153! You might also consider sharing a breakfast of fish and bread during this week. Use the opportunity to talk about Christ's presence at your meal table and God's provision for your daily needs.

SERVICE

While Jesus showed himself to be the Son of God and Lord of all by rising from the dead, he was still willing to serve his followers in humble, practical ways. In John 21, we read that he cooked his disciples breakfast! Follow Jesus' example this week by being "breakfast servants" to one another, such as preparing food, setting the meal table and doing the dishes. Take turns carrying out your morning acts of love and service.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The fish has been used as a Christian symbol from the earliest times of the church. The Greek word for fish is "ixthus" or "icthus." In the Greek language, the five letters making up the word form an acrostic for "Jesus Christ is God's Son, the Savior." The first letter (i) represents the name "Jesus" in Greek; the second letter (x) the title "Christ"; the next two ("thu" in English) "God's Son"; and the final letter (s) the word "Savior."

Many early Christians were put to death for practicing their faith, and so worshiped secretly in homes. A fish painted on the outside door of a house let other Christians know that they would be safe and welcome inside. Make up an IXTHUS symbol to display at the entrance to your home as a sign of your faith in Jesus as your Savior.
