

WE PREPARE...Visions are central in the readings for the sixth Sunday of Easter. In Acts, Paul has a vision about where to go and what to do. The book of Revelation is itself a vision. This portion shows us the promised New Jerusalem coming out of heaven. The Gospel reading from John provides us with a vision of what our future work for god ought to look like.

WORD

FIRST READING Acts 16:9-15

The first reading is in Acts chapter 16, verses 9-15.

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

SECOND READING

Revelations 21:10, 22-22:5


The second reading is in Revelation chapter 21, verse 10 and verse 22 through chapter 22 verse 5.

And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

The Word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**.






GOSPEL John 14:23-29

The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 14th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.





My name is Logan Ryberg, and I am a young man who is a church member of Grace Community Church in New Ulm. I am looking to start up a church slowpitch softball league involving local churches in the New Ulm area who can and want to field a softball team. The goal of this is to organize a family-friendly recreational opportunity for local churches by playing softball together.



Games would be held weekly on Sunday nights through the summer up to the school year, in New Ulm at either or both North Park and Harman Park. Tentatively, games would start June 12th and go to August 21st, with an end of season double-elimination tournament held the final weekend. Each team would be named after the church they represent.

Each participating church would need to field a team of at least 10 players, and at least 5 of the players on-field must be female. To help achieve the male/female player balance: Males ages 16-49 are male players, males younger than 16 or older than 49 are considered female players. Teams can play young kids at their discretion: The goal of these games is to be family-friendly with good sportsmanship expected of all, but please use good judgement on playing young kids on a team.

This church league would limit types of softballs and bats used (only single-wall aluminum or wood bats allowed, no composite or multi-wall bats) and no metal cleats, for player safety. Before the 1st week of games, there would be a meeting to review the full set of rules for the league as well as the schedule. The team manager or at least a representative for each team would be requested to be at the rules and schedule meeting.

Please communicate this within your church to those who may be interested. Please get back to me by Wed June 1st with an answer on whether your church would field a team or not. If yes, please include the name of the team manager with their contact info. Feel free to contact me with questions.

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week: Holy Spirit, please be our teacher. Help us to follow Jesus this week. Amen. (John 14:26)

Mealtime Prayer: Come, Spirit of God, and on us rest, our table to grace, and our food to bless. Amen.

A Blessing to Give: May God show grace to you and bless you. May God smile on you with kindness. Amen. (Psalm 67:1)

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

Tell about a time that you felt a sense of peace that felt filled with God's pres-ence.

How might the peace that Jesus gives be different than the peace that is usually understood in daily life (John 14:27)? Jesus promises the coming of the Holy Spirit who is described as a companion who teaches us Jesus' message. Tell about a time the Holy Spirit seemed to walk alongside and teach you.

DEVOTIONS

In Acts 16:13-15, Paul and his companions share their faith with a woman named Lyd-ia, and the Lord opened her heart to the message that Paul gave. She then opened her home to Paul and his friends. Her home became a place to encourage one another in the faith (see verse 40). How does the Lord open your heart to hear the message of Jesus with faith? How is your home a place to nurture the Christian faith?

SERVICE

When Lydia became a Christian, she invited the Apostle Paul and his companions into her home (Acts 16:15). Invite an individual or group into your home for Christian fel-lowship. Consider using portions of Taking Faith Home to encourage one another in the faith.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

This Thursday (May 5th) is Ascension Day. In many Christian churches this day goes by virtually unnoticed, but it is actually one of the five great festivals of the church and has been celebrated since the fourth century. It marks the last earthly appearance of the Lord Jesus after his resurrection (Mark 16:19; Luke 24:50-53, and Acts 1:1-12). Ascension Day falls on the 40th day of the Easter season

The ascension clarifies the meaning of resurrection. Jesus is the enthroned Lord of heaven and earth forevermore. Put a white or gold piece of cloth over a cross to recall the triumph of God's love over sin and death.
