

## 9:00 A.M. ~ Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> ALLELUIA! SING TO THE LORD A NEW SONG!

WE PREPARE... Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.


SECOND READING

The second reading is in Ephesians chapter 1, verses 11-23.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. 

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.


"Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.





### **Christmas Food Boxes**

It is time to start thinking about filling a Christmas Food Box for the families of our weekend food kids as there continues to be those in our community who are struggling to provide basic needs for their families. We are going to ask you to once again shop for a family and put items on the list in a box provided for you and return it to Trinity. You can join with another family or group to fill one or more boxes. The risk for hunger insecurity has not gone away and we at Trinity are currently feeding 31 children on weekends from 23 families. We are asking you to fill a box to be used by our weekend food families during the Christmas break when they do not have meals provided by the school.

### **Morning Snack Boxes**

Trinity has another opportunity to help our school children this year. There is a need for snacks during morning break so if you would like to fill a box full of snacks, grab a snack box and fill that to help our students.

### Here's what to do:

- 1. Sign out a Christmas food box or a morning snack box in the narthex beginning Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup>. Put your name and phone number next to the number matching the number on your box.
- 2. Fill the box with the items from the food list.
- 3. Return your box to the table in the narthex by Sunday, December 11.



As each candle is lit, say these words together, "Thank you, God, for the earthly life of (Name), and for the new life they have in you."

### **SERVICE**

Send a sympathy card from your household to a person who is mourning the death of a friend or family member. Include them in your prayers throughout the week.

### RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Visit a local cemetery as a household. Look at the different gravestones and take note of symbols of Christian faith. Talk together about the hope that Christians have in the face of death because of Jesus.
