

We come to celebrate God's presence among us!


We come to follow Jesus, who leads us to New Life;

The All Saints' Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. Martin Luther held that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint--a sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus.



for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."



For several years now our congregation has faced various challenges, a significant erosion of financial resources is one. Our intent is to strongly heighten awareness & ask for your help. The decline in giving towards the "General Fund" for the budget coupled with increases in operating costs is our primary concern.

We are very grateful for faithful Givers within our Congregation. Gifts are used to support Gods work according to the wishes of the Giver via the "general fund" and / or the "non-budget fund".

<u>"General Fund"</u> gifts support projected expenses per the annual budget related to the overhead required to operate the church facility, staff salaries, education, evangelism, and youth programs, plus a benevolent tithe to the ELCA Synod *just to name a few*.

"Non-budget fund" gifts support special giving specified by the Giver. A few examples are Meals that matter, Youth trips, Lutheran World Relief, Bible Camp, Food Backpacks, Endowment / memorial Funds. The Building Fund account is in the "non-budget fund" which is used to fund capital building improvements such as the recent building improvement projects.

Per the table below, budgetary & actual spending reductions have occurred. Recently reductions of expenses <u>in</u> <u>part</u> have come via the sacrifice of Staff salary increases, reductions to the Synod and certain programing, <u>much of which is unsustainable</u>. Significant inflationary pressures have added to the financial challenges as well.

Reserve funds (savings) designated for budgetary expenses <u>are depleted</u>, having been used to bridge the gaps between actual giving & actual expenses. Therefore, to meet the most basic obligations, we are forced to borrow from the "non-budget" fund with a balance of \$29,799.84 as of 10/11/23, these funds that are used towards budgetary expenses are then unavailable for their designated purpose going against the Giver(s) wishes. Presuming they can be these funds will need to be paid back. The current trend would result in all forms of reserve cash being exhausted at some point in 2024.

You may say budget concerns are not new, so what's different now? The answer is previously cutting expenses and / or use of reserve general funds would get us through the year. As indicated reserve general funds are depleted and expense reduction options are limited, threating the work of our Congregation like never before which will force significant changes.

For your review, along with a copy of this letter you will be receiving your Q3 giving statement which will include prior years giving. We pray we can pull together as a Congregation and work towards securing Gods work, through our hands by getting us back to a stable financial footing — to do this we are asking for your help. We understand inflation is impacting many in their personal lives, but any additional help you can provide is meaningful. We are confident in your response and together we turn our eyes to the Lord for guidance to whom all things are possible!




