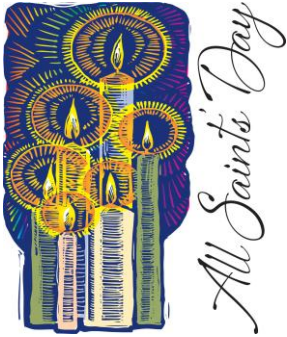

WORD

FIRST READING

Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18

The first reading is in Daniel chapter 7, verses 1-3 and 15-18. The book of Daniel was written in the second century BCE, when the Syrian king Antiochus Epiphanes was severely persecuting the Jews. Daniel's vision of the four beasts proclaims that human kings will come and go, but the kingdom will ultimately belong to God and to God's people.

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.

As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever — forever and ever."

SECOND READING

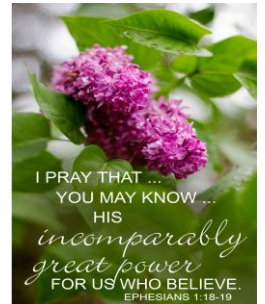
Ephesians 1:11-23

The second reading is in Ephesians chapter 1, verses 11-23. After giving thanks for the faith of the Ephesians, the writer of this letter prays that they might understand the wisdom, hope, and power of God that is embodied in Jesus Christ.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

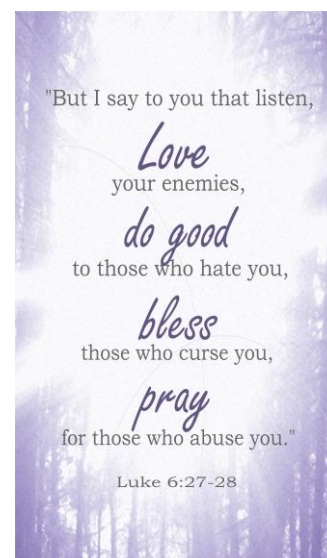

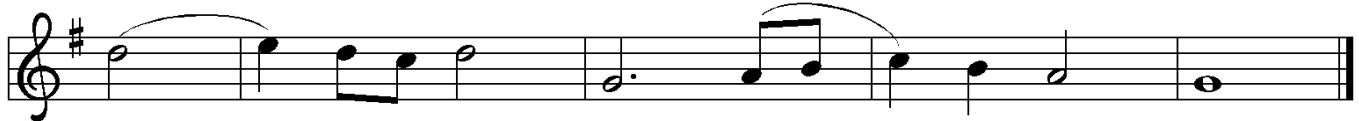

There are those in our community who are struggling to provide basic needs for their families. In the state of Minnesota 1 out of 7 children is at risk for hunger. One in four Minnesota households with children are food insecure. Currently we are feeding 49 children from 36 families. We are asking you to shop for a family and put items on the list in a box provided for you. These boxes will be given to the families prior to the Christmas break when children do not have access to breakfast and lunch at school. The FFA will be giving each child a fleece blanket and personal care products. *Thank you for being the hands of Jesus.*

2. **Commercial Financing:** Will be considered only if needed.

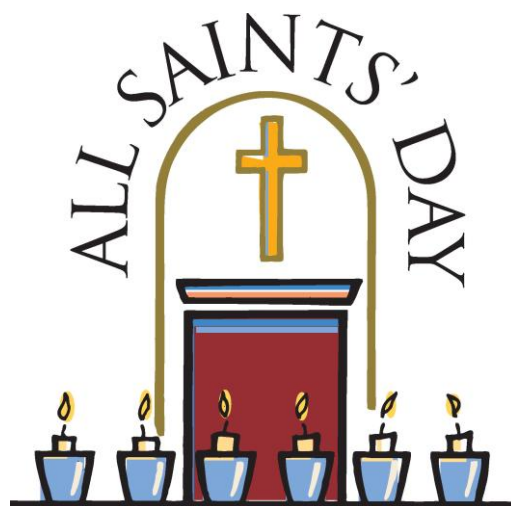

DEVOTIONS

The first Sunday in November is All Saints Sunday, the day to remember Christians who have "finished the race" and entered God's heavenly kingdom. Ephesians 1:15-16 states, "I have heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people. So I never stop being grateful for you, as I mention you in my prayers." Talk about family and friends who have died and have been an example of faith for which you give thanks. Talk about their lives of faith and service then offer prayers of thanksgiving for their witness.

SERVICE

On All Saints Sunday we are called to remember those around us who are grieving. Is there someone you know who is mourning a loved one? Call, send a card or a message using social media, bring him/her a bunch of flowers or a plate of treats.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Set aside time to light candles in remembrance of friends or loved ones who have died. Have a minute of silence, then read aloud 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. Look at pictures of your departed loved ones and share stories about their lives. If possible, visit their gravesites. Take along flowers to leave behind in their honor.
