From Pastor Tim....

It is always healthy to be reading something. Many people like to have a traditional book with the feel of good paper in hand. I myself, have so many books I now use a Kindle, and I have a Kindle app on all of my iPads and MacBooks. I just need the discipline to make myself sit and let my mind get into the reading and allow the author to teach me a lesson or to touch my heart. As I look at my Kindle library, I notice plenty of theology, history, stories about great mystics, and even a book entitled "How to Relax," by Thick That Hanh. Many of my books help me learn to open myself up to learn about God, or to help me, "Read God." Almost all my books would fall under the category of "Spiritual Reading." Henry Nouwen, in his devotional, "*You Are the Beloved," helped me learn about Spiritual Reading in a new and fantastic way. For example:

"Spiritual Reading is not only reading about spiritual people or spiritual things. It is also reading spiritually, that is, in a spiritual way! Reading in a spiritual way is reading with a desire to let God come closer to us.... The purpose of spiritual reading...is not to master knowledge or information but to let God's Spirit master us. Strange as it may sound, spiritual reading means to let ourselves be **read by God!**... Spiritual reading is reading with an inner attentiveness to the movement of God's Spirit in our outer and inner lives. With that attentiveness, we will allow God to read us and to explain to us what we are truly about. Here and Now."

Let us all gather for worship and through confession and absolution let God cleanse us from all unrighteousness so that we can open our heart and soul up to God boldly and without fear so that God can read us through and through. Worship and praising God is the means in which we approach God and God approaches us and there is complete and utter freedom. Let God read our heart, and let God find Jesus.

A Statement on the Killing of Tyre Nichols

January 20, 2023



"Christians in their longing for Christ find themselves deeply immersed in the sufferings of the world. Christians are not aloof spectators, watching the world's troubles. ... Faith leads us into solidarity with suffering." —ELCA social statement, The Church and Criminal Justice: Hearing the Cries (2013)

As the nation watches another video exposing police violence against a Black man after a traffic stop, there will be great suffering and despair emerging from across the United States. In just over a week we have witnessed mass gun violence in California – twice – and the shooting of a protester at a future police training site in Atlanta. Each of these tragedies inspires grief, not only for the lives lost and forever altered but also for our loss of confidence in a system that continues to fail us, over and over.

It's important to remember that images are powerful and can retraumatize communities. The anticipated video footage of 29-year-old Memphis resident Tyre Nichols being beaten promises to stir many emotions and reawaken the grief of tens of millions of Americans who have seen this in their own communities. It will feel personal for those who have witnessed this trauma inflicted upon their own families.

As Americans, we must all face this problem. Together we must cry out, much as Rachael wept in loud lamentation, "How long, O Lord?"

How long, O Lord, will we need to suffer at the hands of injustice?

How long, O Lord, will we hear of lives taken by another shooting and fear for our own lives and our families' lives?

How long, O Lord, will we fear a system that is supposed to protect all lives?

Dear church, now is the time to focus, listen, learn, counsel, advocate for just reforms, and lament a grief that seems relentless, that is awoken again with each act of tragedy and injustice across this nation.

Third graders and parents: Look for information coming home soon regarding First Communion preparation as well as receiving your new Bibles!





The 2022 annual reports have been printed and are available for members to pick up and review. The Board of Stewardship is very thankful for the faithful members and friends that made contributions to the general fund, building fund and special projects during the past year. A few highlights are as follows:

The Endowment Fund continues to grow and a deposit of \$4,258.76 was made in 2022 with proceeds from the Fohl Estate, Cathy Blackstad's parent trust and in memory of Juliann Wahlborg's uncle. The investments showed a loss during the year but the committee saw a promise of hope at the end of the year with the balance rising. The balance at the end of November was \$75,082.91. The committee is now ready to begin offering funds for non-budget purposes. Applications and deadlines will be forthcoming.

The **Capital Campaign** had a goal of \$200,000.00 that was approved at the annual meeting in 2022. Pledges and gifts totaled \$39,348.00 in 2022. One loan of \$20,000.00 was accepted. Expenditures were \$49,700.00. These included the street assessment, replace furnaces in the church, insulate and reside the parsonage, repair the parsonage patio and re-landscaping the parsonage and church alleyway. The current balance in the Building Fund is around \$11,000.00. The windows in the library are scheduled to be replaced in the summer of 2023.

Total receipts for the **General Fund** were \$285,263.02 and expenditures were \$300,810.82 with a budget of \$304,000.00. The approved budget for 2023 is \$298,000.00. During the year, many special offerings are planned and members and friends supported these with gifts of \$50,651.00 which are non-budget accounts. Thank you for providing over \$375,000.00 in monetary gifts to Trinity in 2022!

An item to note for 2023 is to designate Trinity as the recipient of your Thrivent Choice Dollars if you have a policy with them that generates these funds. Each year after April 1, this has to be done by calling in or going on line to do it. The committee uses your donation for smaller requests not included in the budget.

Noisy offerings generated over \$600.00 last year for special causes: Food Shelf, Backpack program, World Hunger and Vacation Bible School. This January we did Food Shelf and the next one will be in April. Ash Wednesday and Quarter Folders will provide scholarships for youth going to Green Lake Bible Camp this summer.

Keep the financial needs of Trinity in your thoughts and prayers during the year and thank you again for your tithes and gifts.




