



#### The Epiphany of our Lord

Matthew 2:1-12

"Epiphany" is a church-word that, ironically, has provided little insight to most people, so a definition might help: Disctionary.com has as its third meaning "a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of something, usually initiated by some simple, homely, or commonplace occurrence or experience."

God uses a star, or the movements of planets, to tip off Gentile astrologers to the coming of the King of the Jews. How generous of God not to keep that a secret from these bystanders, who, just by doing their ordinary jobs, discover the entry of God into the world in the birth of Jesus. It would have been far safer for Jesus, and for the other boy babies of Bethlehem, to have kept a lid on that information. Of course, generosity can be dangerous. Maybe not life and death dangerous, as it is here, but any time a person gives generously there is a loss of what that resource or asset could have done for the giver, if only he or she had not given it away. God assumes the risk of generously revealing God's presence in Jesus over and over again—this is only an early epiphany. Eventually, the risk is proven to be read and Jesus is put to death, but God has always seen it as a risk worth taking.

The magi respond with generosity—how could they do otherwise? They have an inkling that this child will have an impact on the world that they cannot imagine, so they generously give their time in travel, their honor in homage, and their gifts in worship.



On January 6 Christians celebrate Epiphany, when the Magi came to worship baby Jesus. Epiphany, which means an appearance or manifestation, symbolizes the first recognition of the

means an appearance or manifestation, symbolizes the first recognition of the Savior by non-Jews. Because Epiphany also is a reminder that Jesus came as the light of the whole world, its symbols include light, candles and a star.

How did the wise men know — and how do we know — that Jesus is the light of the world? As preacher George Buttrick said, "It would little avail to ask how we know. That would be like asking how we know that Beethoven's 'Hymn to Joy' is joyous. If a man were to say, 'It is not joyous to me,' he would not condemn the music; he would tell only his morbidness. There is no logic to establish an axiom, for an axiom is the basis of all logic; and the soul of Jesus has axiomatic truth. Jesus is light, and there is no proof for light except light itself."
