

WE PREPARE: Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins on Wednesday. On the Mount of Transfiguration Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem....

This week we turn to Ash Wednesday and our annual journey from Lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This word of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be brought out and sung again on Easter morning.

we confess that we have turned from your way to follow our own ways.


Forgive us for the times we have spoken or acted too quickly;

WORD

FIRST READING Exodus 24:12-18

The first reading is from Exodus, Chapter 24, verses 12-18.

The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them."

Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

The Word of the Lord; Thanks be to God.


SECOND READING 2 Peter 1:16-21


The Second Reading is from 2 Peter, Chapter 1, verses 16-21.

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.




GOSPEL Matthew 17:1-9
The Gospel is found in Matthew chapter 17, verses 1-9. Glory to you, O Lord."

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."



SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK

While Peter was still speaking, a bright cloud surrounded them. A voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, and I love him. I am very pleased with him. Listen to him!" Matthew 17:5

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week: Lord, help us to pay attention to your Word so that faith shines forth from our hearts. Amen. (2 Peter 1:19) Mealtime Prayer: God, our provider, you are full of love and full of might. May we shine for you with faith so bright. Amen. A Blessing to Give: May the Lord Jesus bring you peace when you are afraid. May you listen to him and look to him, now and always.

CARING CONVERSATION

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Are you a good listener? What is involved in listening carefully to others?
- The voice from heaven said, "Listen to him." In what ways do you listen to Jesus?
- What helps you to listen to Jesus? What stops you from listening?

DEVOTIONS

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday, the first of the 40 days of Lent. Traditionally, Christians receive ashes on their heads on this day as a reminder of their mortality and a sign of sorrow for sin. Have a small Ash Wednesday observance in your home. Prepare in advance a small bowl of ashes to use.

<u>Leader</u>: God's Word tells us that our earthen bodies will one day return to dust (Genesis 3:19). But, Jesus Christ saves us from sin (Romans 8:11). As Lent begins today, let us pray for faith in him.

<u>Prayer:</u> Lord God, as the season of Lent begins today, we confess our need for a Savior. Help us to trust and follow Jesus. Amen. Take turns making the sign of the cross with ashes on one another's foreheads, saying these words: "Repent and look to Jesus your Savior, for dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

<u>Leader</u>: God remembers that we are dust and has compassion for us. The Lord's love is with those who worship him. Go in peace.

Amen.

SERVICE

Consider giving up a household treat, food or activity for Lent. Each week, put aside the amount of money saved by doing so. Decide on a charitable cause and donate the money at the end of Lent.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The day before Ash Wednesday is called Shrove Tuesday. The name "shrove" comes from the practice of being "shriven"—going to church to confess your sins and receive absolution before the start of Lent. Shrove Tuesday is also sometimes called Pancake Tuesday or Fat Tuesday because households used up their remaining eggs and fats before Lent by making pancakes on this day. Have a Shrove Tuesday pancake breakfast or dinner. As you eat, talk about what Jesus gave up for our sake, and what you could give up during Lent to prepare spiritually for Easter.
